

SCORESHEET PROCEDURE

A table is set up downstairs each Saturday where each team will be able to pick up the scoresheet prior to the game commencing from the peephole marked with the Court the team is playing on. The team listed first on the draw (left hand side) is the team to collect the scoresheet. Please feel free to grab a folder to lean on. The team that wins the toss (has the first centre pass) will become the “official scorer”. Please ensure you abide by our policy documentation which states the following:

“6.4 The official scorer must have the score sheet in clear view of the scorer of the opposing team and **both** shall sit near the middle of a sideline”.

“6.5 Failure to comply with rule 6.4 above, will result in the opposing team becoming the official scorer”.

At the conclusion of the game the **score sheet becomes the responsibility of the winning team and MUST BE PROMPTLY RETURNED TO THE RED SCORESHEET BOX UPSTAIRS.**

If any team would like a copy of their scoresheet, they can be photocopied upstairs at any time during the day.

Names on these scoresheets have automatically generated from the database. Please ensure you check these names carefully and advise of any changes, ie a player who has been de-registered from the team appears on the scoresheet or player missing. All borrowed players need to be written on the section of the scoresheet and what team and grade they are from.

Please ensure you fill in all appropriate information as listed below for each playing category.

NETTA SCORESHEETS – minimum requirements listed below, other areas on the scoresheet are optional:

- Write down position played each quarter for each Player;
- Put an “A” next to Player Name if absent;
- Record any Borrowed Players and ensure to include the grade & team name;
- Mark off goals and attempts;
- Sign scoresheet – Umpire, Scorer and Captain (not compulsory).

JUNIOR SCORESHEETS – minimum requirements listed below, other areas on the scoresheet are optional:

- Record a tick against each player that takes the court;
- Put an “A” next to Player Name if absent;
- Record any Borrowed Players and ensure to include the grade & team name;
- Mark off goals in Progressive Score;
- Centre Pass, Attempts and Injury time are optional areas to complete;
- Sign scoresheet – Umpire, Scorer and Captain.

SENIOR SCORESHEETS – minimum requirements listed below, other areas on the scoresheet are optional:

- Each player taking the court must sign against their name;
- Put an “A” next to Player Name if absent;
- Record any Borrowed Players and ensure to include the grade & team name;
- Mark off goals in pre-numbered section;
- Record Final Score in relevant boxes;
- Sign scoresheet – Umpire, Scorer and Captain.
